Planning the next NW meeting

Quick review

So far

- Two NW meetings per countries were organised in each country except for Slovenia who organised one last Thursday.
- This means 11 NW meetings in total

Objective (DoW)

- 36 NW meetings

Remaining

- 4 NW for each country meetings until September 2011

Dirty assessment of the first meetings

- Overall good participation but big differences in stakeholders types and number between countries
- In numerous meetings, people come to listen but do not participate. Low interactivity.
Good for project visibility but not for networking
- Higher interactivity and lively networking meetings when researchers of the consortium involved in WP work present methodologies / results
- Some meetings hijacked by one or two people
- SEEDEV not used enough in the meetings preparation
